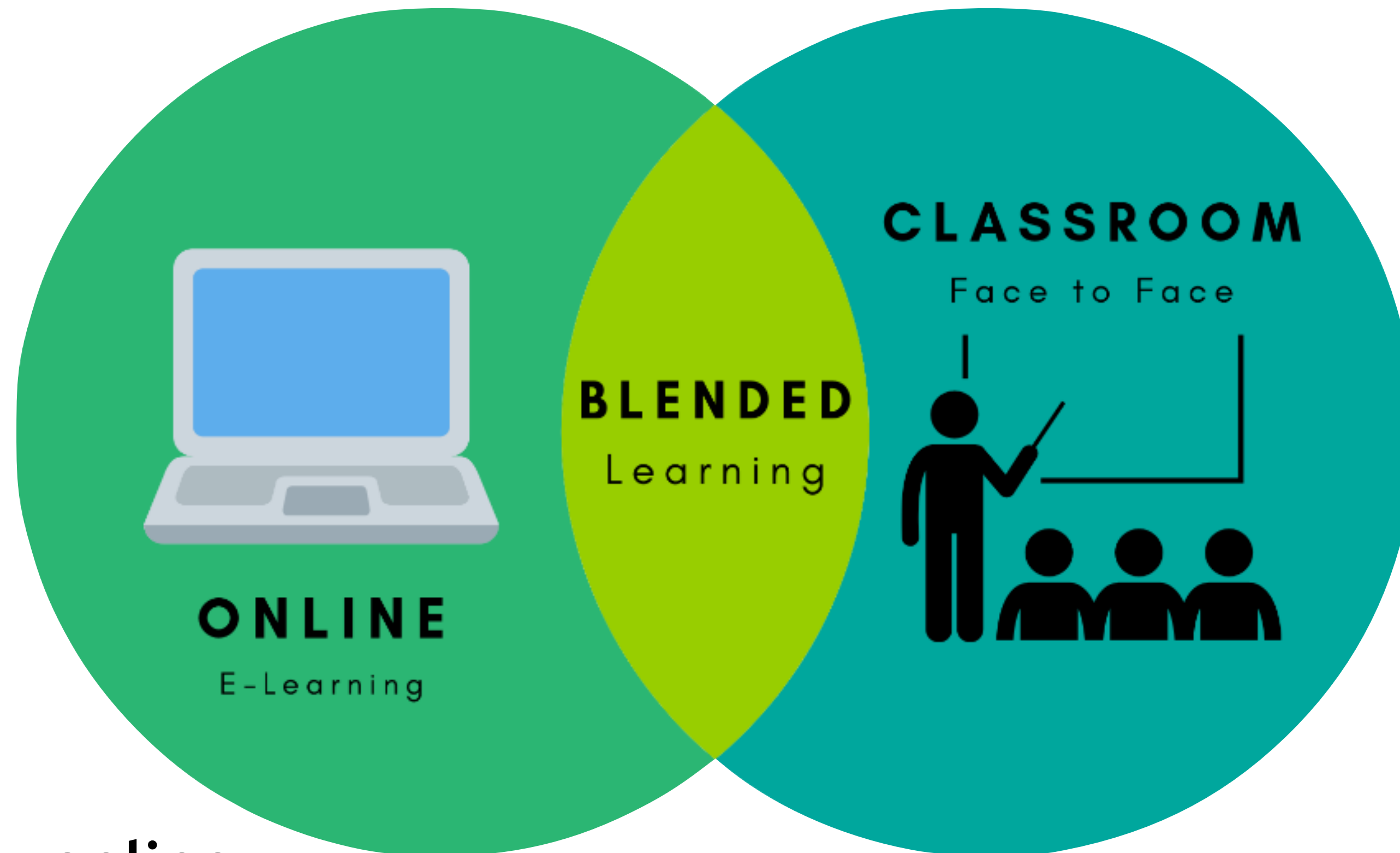

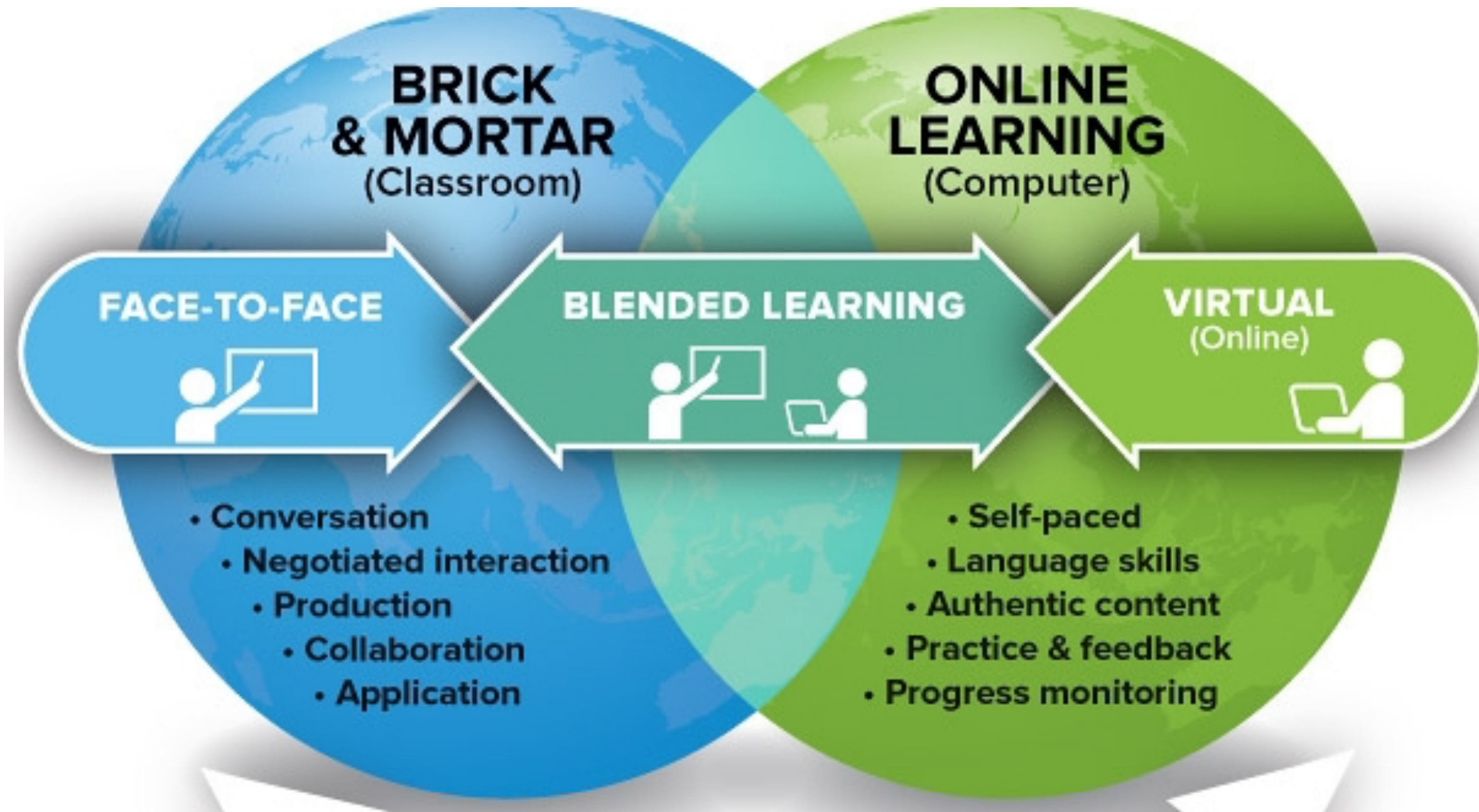

# 3 real world examples



This is Nammin.

Every week her teacher chooses a video from **“Steve & Maggie” Youtube channel** that relates to the topic in English class.

Nammin watches the video for homework over the weekend. She enjoys watching Youtube videos and her parents like that she is practicing listening at home.

In class, the students discuss what they learned from watching the video and do a vocabulary worksheet.

# 3 real world examples



This is a special English reading class.

There are 10 English storybooks that children can choose to read each week.

The teacher has made **storytelling videos** for each story book using her smartphone and a tripod.

The students enjoy watching videos of their teacher telling the same stories that they are reading.



# 3 real world examples

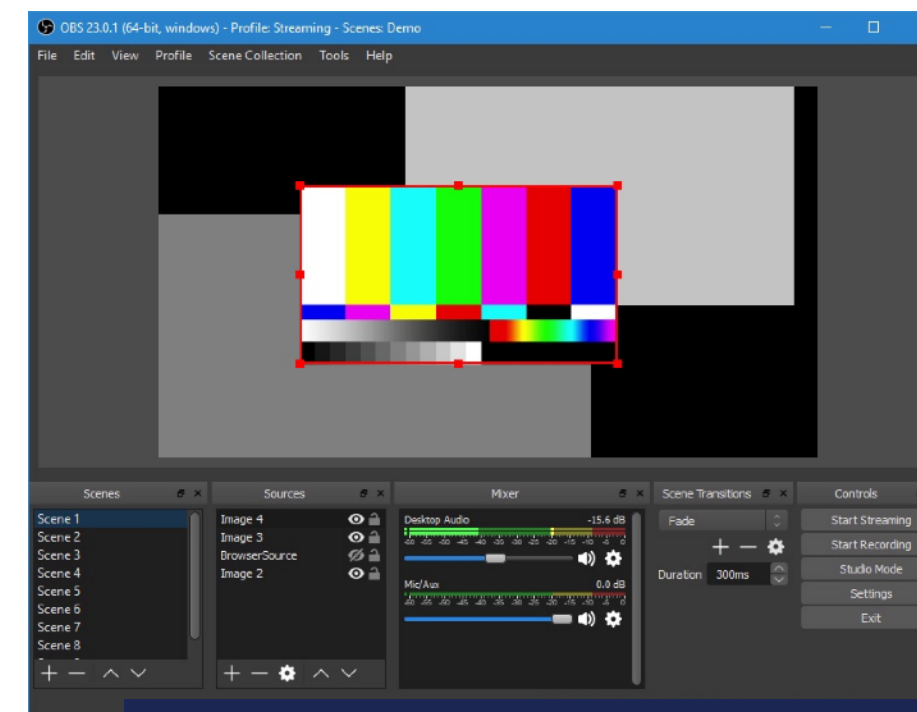


This is a grade 6 English class.

They have an important English test at the end of the year.

The teacher has made videos using **OBS Studio** reviewing all of the vocabulary, expressions, and grammar that will be included in the test.

Students can watch the videos in their own time to review the test content.

- Youtube



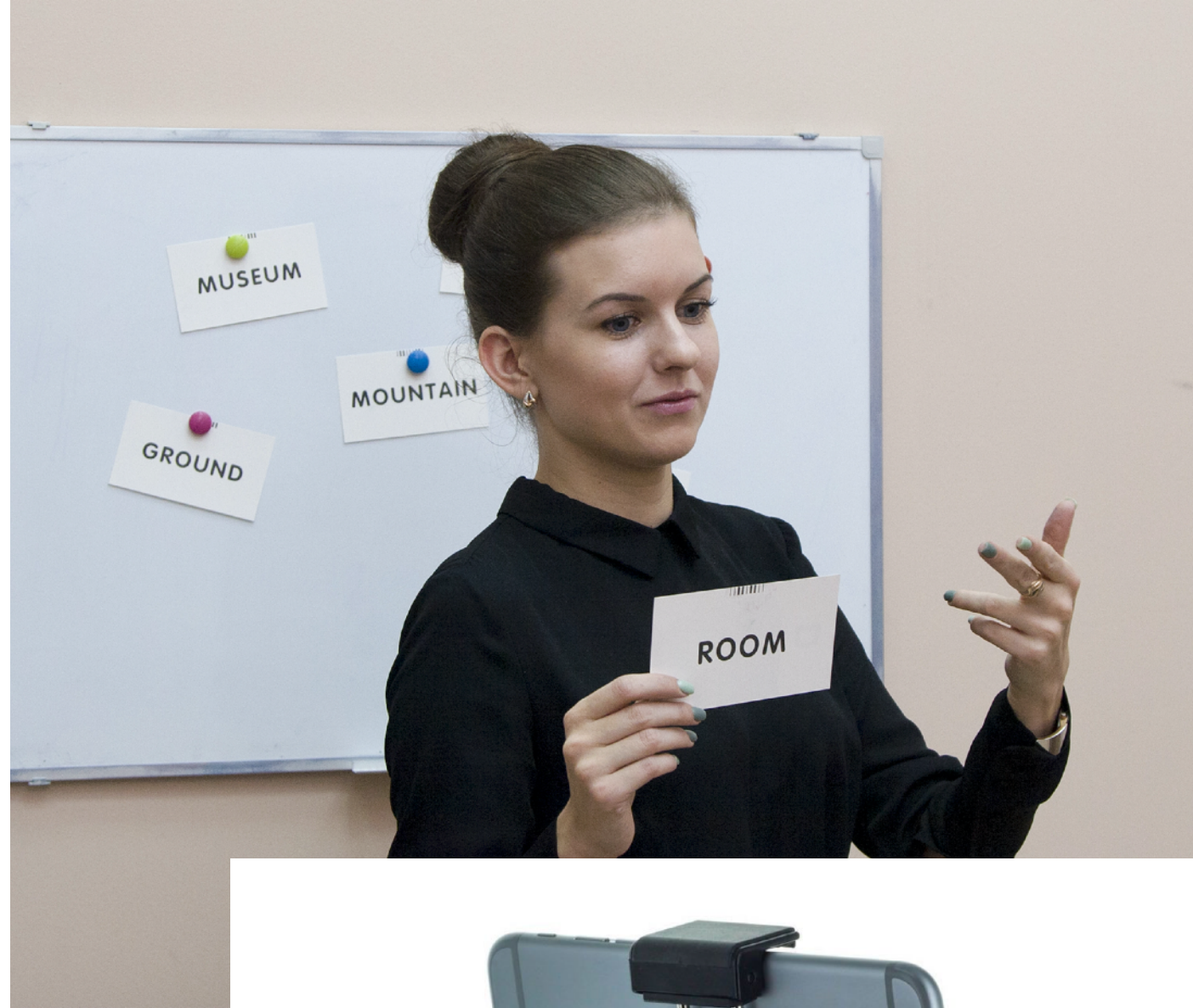

**OBS Studio is a free broadcasting software.**

**It's easy to use, but when you first open the software you need to set up the audio and video input.**

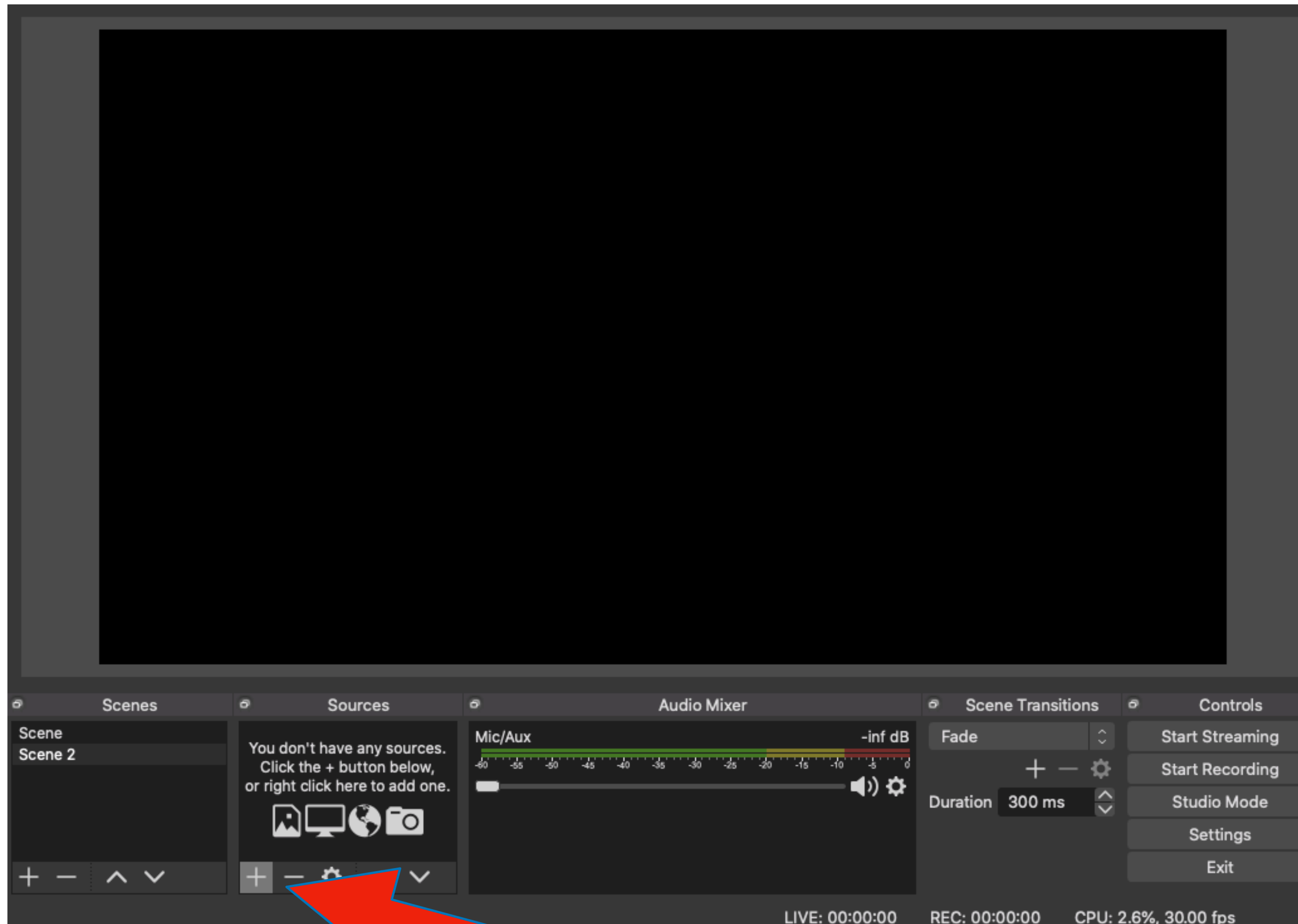


This video is made with OBS Studio.

It has 3 inputs (these are called sources):

- **Desktop** (my laptop displays a full screen PPT)
- **Audio** (I use a USB microphone)
- **Webcam** (for the video of me in the corner)

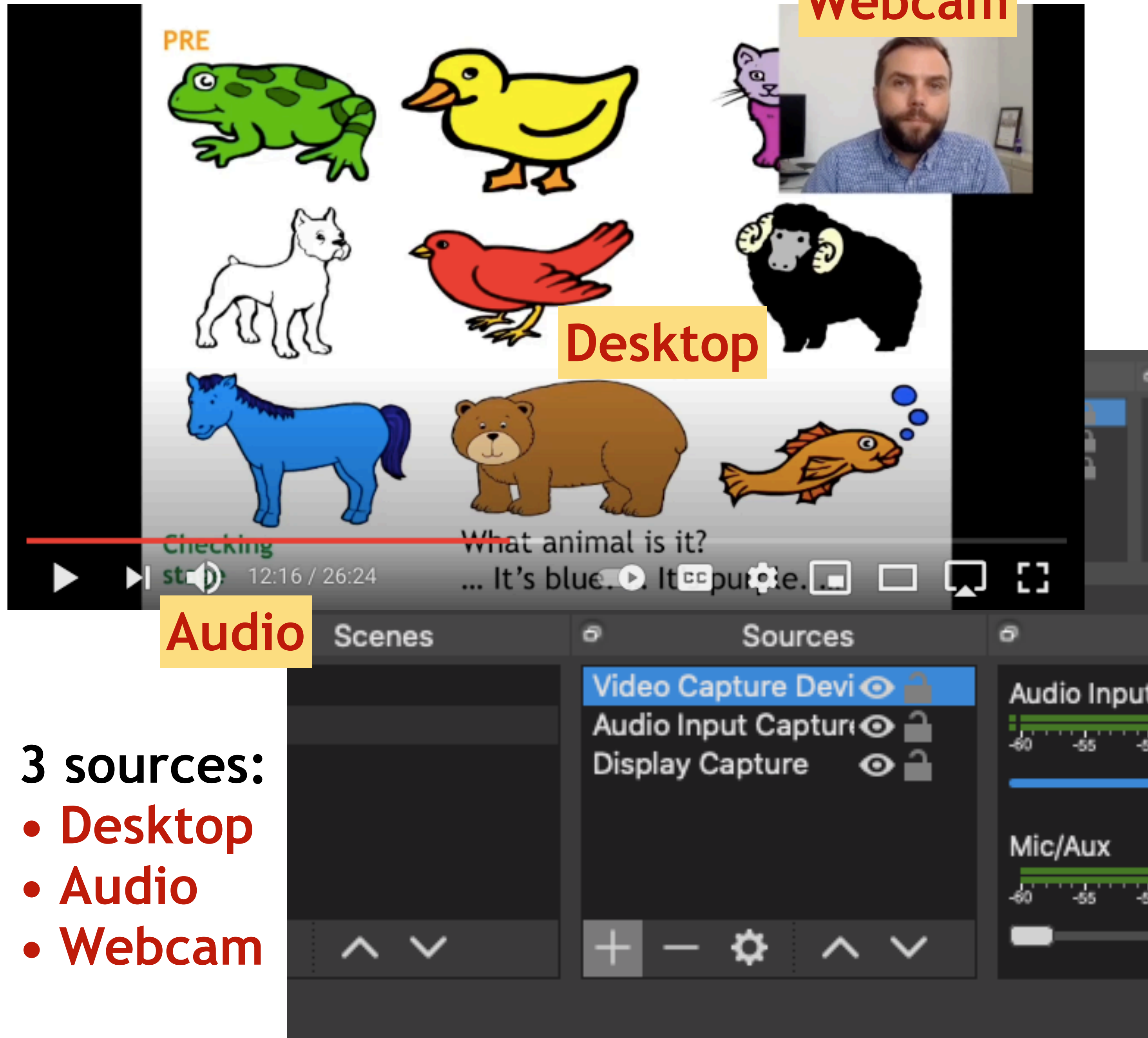
**1. Click the + button to add sources**



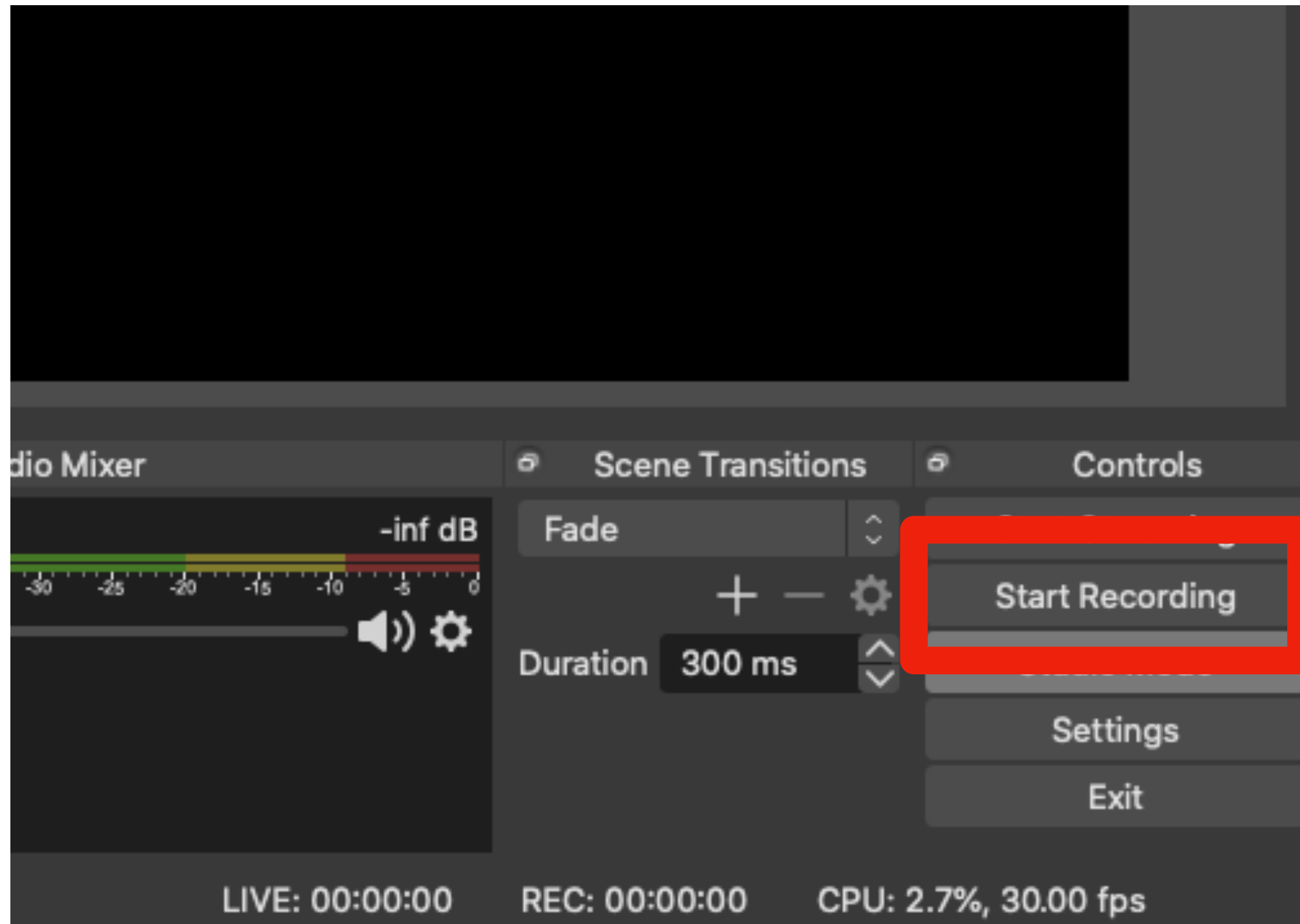
