

Course Introduction

Teaching English Grammar

- 1. This course will give an overview to the teaching of grammar including historical perspectives and the major current approaches.
- 2. The focus will be on practically applying the lessons from theory. Example teaching and activities will support this.
- 3. Teaching at different levels such as beginner, intermediate, and advanced with practical techniques will be included, as well as key issues such as class sizes, multi-level classes, and using technology.
- 4. Participants will have many opportunities to put theory into practice with micro-teaching components to the course.

Week 5. Student micro-teaching for beginner learners (drills, info gaps, comprehension check questions, and more)


Week 6. Grammar for <u>intermediate</u> learners: Principles and tasks (Nunan)


Week 7. Student micro-teaching for intermediate learners (conscious-raising, problem solving, surveys, and more)
